DUTIES:

- Fieldwork involves on-foot beach surveys for breeding & nesting, nest checks, other field observations on predation, disturbance, and tourism use of beaches.
- Taking of scientific field notes, data entry & checking.
- Installation, maintenance, and distribution of awareness materials (brochures, signage, nest protection).
- Engaging with public beach visitors, community members, and school groups regarding conservation awareness, education, and mitigation techniques.
- Producing educational & awareness materials, participation in related events.
- Miscellaneous administrative tasks and project involvement.
- 5-6 working days per week, including weekends and public holidays.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Self-motivated, able to work independently & with others while following methodology & procedure.
- Trustworthy, show integrity & dedication to making accurate observations, sense of responsibility/accountability.
- Observational skills, with particular attention to detail.
- An interest in birds and coastal conservation research.
- Physical fitness, willingness to spend long hours in the field in potentially averse conditions (i.e. up to 12 hrs
 walking in soft sand & some coastal rock scrambling, in summer heat with salt spray & wind, while carrying
 pack).
- Ability to obtain necessary visa (some informational assistance available).
- Preferably have or be studying toward a qualification in a related biological field, such as Zoology, Ecology, Ornithology, Conservation Biology, Environmental Science, Nature Conservation, Science Communication/Education, Wildlife/Natural Resource Management, etc.
- Some field experience with birding, nest searching, colour band re-sighting, animal tracking, and/or bird handling would be advantageous, but is not necessary. Your willingness to learn & actively participate is most important!
- Some experience with GPS/GIS technology & software beneficial.
- Ability to engage with the public regarding research & conservation.
