ORIGINATING SUMMONS

LET ALL PARTIES concerned attend before the judge on the . day of 2011 at ____ AM/PM for the hearing of an application by The Plaintiff for the following orders that:

1. The Minister Mentor Lee Kuan Yew's statements, that
 - a. Multi-racialism in Singapore was "progressing very nicely until the surge of Islam came", and that
 - b. "the other communities have easier integration -friends, inter-marriages and so on - than Muslims... we can integrate all religions and races, except Islam."

are tantamount to a racism against Muslims subject to the interpretation of the Maintenance of Religious Harmony Act (Cap.167A).

2. The Minister Mentor and his current and previous government had adopted such discriminatory practices which had formed the foundation of government policies since 1959 that has led to racist policies and laws instituted against the minority Malays, Muslims and Indians, which is the reason why Singapore does not have a Malay Muslim or Indian as a Prime Minister and this violates the National Anthem and the National Pledge in breach of the tenets in the latter that "regardless of race, language or religion" to the choice of the Prime Minister only selected from the Chinese race.
3. The subject remarks reflect discriminatory policies against the Muslims and the Malays by the Singapore state and thereby unduly infringing the rights of Muslims in practicing their faith, hence violating Article 15 of the Singapore Constitution and relegating the Malays who are the original inhabitants of the Land of Singapore to one of third-class citizens, vis-à-vis the Chinese and Indians, thereby violating Article 152 of the Singapore Constitution that gives special position to the Malays as original inhabitants.
4. The subject remarks and the discriminatory practices infringe the rights of the Malays in failing to recognise the special position of the Malays enshrined under Article 152 of the Singapore Constitution and their right to practise their religion enshrined under Article 153 of the Singapore Constitution.

5. The Housing and Development Board's ethnic quota policies that deny the rights of the minority Malays and Indians their right to freedom of association of their own ethnic group in a particular constituency and diluting their right to form majority status in such constituencies and have the choice of their own leaders representing them in Parliament are in violation of Articles 12 and 14 of the Singapore Constitution.
