Another fantastic eReader for kids is the Barnes and Noble Nook. This one is popular because of its colored touch screen exhibit. The graphics are clear and sharp and can be read outdoors even in bright sunlight with no glare from the screen. The fonts and styles are all adjustable to individual taste. Your kid will have access to a wide choice of over 2.5 million publications, magazines and newspapers. There is the option of getting interactive kids' books, Nook comics or Marvel graphic novels. The machine has a 2GB inner memory but it can assist a memory card of 32GB. Your child can also access the internet, play games and listen to music.

Pandigital came up with an eReader that has an LCD color touch screen with very high resolution for better images. The Pandigital Novel eReader can come with a useful stylus and built-in dictionary and Wi-Fi. It operates on an Android operating program so you can install

different e-Book reading functions for your kid. It offers both sound and picture support, including mp3 playback and slide shows. Pandigital partnered with the Barnes and Noble e-Book store offering your kid access to hundreds of publications and magazines downloadable via Wi-Fi.

Sony also has good eReaders for kids. There are various types in the market but the best one for your child would be the Sony PRS-600, available in silver, red and black. This gadget has an e-Ink show and a highly sensitive touch screen. It can handle PDF and e-Pub files so your kid has a wide decision of publications to choose from and has an expandable memory for storage. It has a USB port for easy charging and an mp3 player that you can listen to utilizing headphones. It has a stylus that makes it possible for your child to draw, pick out text and enter notes. The battery power supply lasts for a long time meaning the gadget can stay on all day.

The Hanvon WISEreader is an affordable option compared to other eReaders. The e-Ink screen provides your child a good reading experience without damaging his/her eyes. The backside is scratch and slip resistant so it can withstand a lot of rough handling. The Hanvon has a speaker for sound use with a text-to-speech performance to read aloud to your child and is compatible with both PDF and e-Pub files. The screen permits for landscape and portrait orientation and it has numerical keys on one side for easy navigation. Your child can use headphones to listen to the mp3 playback and the expandable memory has storage for many e-Books.

Google has developed an eReader popularly known as the iRiver Story HD. With this device, your child will have immediate access to over 3 million Google's e-publications via Wi-Fi. Adobe e-Books are also accessible. There is a four-way button to navigate pages in lieu of a touch screen. The main benefit for the Google's eReader is its integration with the Google's e-publication system.

Books have been around for hundreds of years, so why go digital with an eReader? Here are some of the best eReader features that should make you consider switching from physical books to eBooks.

Perhaps the single largest advantage of using an eReader is the convenient storage and easy portability of your entire library. Rather than carry your technical library to work or your favorite books to the beach, which could easily weigh down a backpack or suitcase or worse, you can store thousands of books in a size and weight smaller than a typical hardcover physical book.

In addition to storage and portability, most eReaders offer the ability to search through books to find a particular word or topic immediately. For some, this is critical especially when reading work- or school-related books.

eReaders do cost more than purchasing one book, but eBooks are typically less expensive than physical books including softcover versions. In addition, a large number of books are available free of charge. At the beginning of each new year since 1724 (when the first copyrights expired), readers have looked forward to the expiration of copyrights as books are entered into the public domain.

On January 1st, 2011, the following items will enter into the public domain:

- \* Walt Disney's original movie of Peter Pan
- \* James Bond's first adventure of Casino Royale
- \* First issue of Playboy magazine
- \* Ray Bradbury's Fahrenheit 451
- \* JD Salinger's Nine Stories
- \* Agatha Christie's A Pocket Full of Rye
- \* and CS Lewis' The Silver Chair, #4 in the Narnia series.

Libraries are now beginning to provide more current eBook titles for limited time checkout. Publishers now often provide free samples in eBook formats. eBooks can be printed for less than traditional printed books too using on-demand eBook printers.

eBook readers have access to over 3 million books available in the Google eBookstore alone and with the digital nature of eBooks, these books are available at any time of the day or night, 365 days a year, provided there is an Internet connection. These eBooks can be purchased or borrowed, downloaded and consumed immediately instead of having to drive to a bricks-and-mortar bookstore or library to purchase or borrow during limited hours. Parents can download "The Night Before Christmas" to read to their little ones at bedtime on Christmas Eve even after the stores have closed.

eBooks are able to be backed up (if DRM is disabled or gives permission) which allows for recovery in case of loss or damage. If a device is somehow destroyed or stolen, an eBook

collection can be easily recovered, provided the owner ran a backup faithfully. Comparitively, if someone has a house fire and loses his/her physical library, he/she must re-purchase all his/her physical books.

eBooks are much cheaper and easier to publish and distribute than physical books. This opens the door for authors to self-publish eBooks.

Printed books use 3 times as many raw materials and 78 times more water to produce than eBooks due to consumption of materials such as paper and ink and the energy used to run the printing presses.

Many, if not most, eReaders provide the reader the ability to read in low light or total darkness, enlarge or change fonts to suit the reader, read text aloud, search for terms, find definitions, and allow for highlighting, bookmarking and annotation. E-Ink devices can imitate the look and readability of printed books. These devices use little power, allowing for up to a month of reading before having to recharge.

### 1) The Kindle Store

Anyone who has ever used Amazon will tell you how easy and intuitive it is to use and Amazon's Kindle store is no different. Whether you are searching for ebooks, looking for reviews, looking for special offers or just downloading an ebook, its simple navigation and layout make it a breeze. Simply the best out there and crucially the pricing is very competitive too.

### 2) It has a 3G model

The Kindle Touch (and the older Kindle keyboard) are the only eReaders out there at the moment that also have a 3G model. This is invaluable if like me you are always out and about. You don't need to worry about finding somewhere with Wi-Fi, you can just access the Kindle store, download books, surf the web and even access your social networks whenever and pretty much wherever you want.

### 3) Great Audio Functions

Unlike it's closest competitor - the Nook Simple Touch, the Kindle Touch has audio functionality. This means you can listen to audiobooks, download and listen to MP3s and of course use the cool text-to-speech feature. This allows the Kindle to read content out loud for you including summaries of magazines and newspapers.

### 4) Free Cloud Backup

This lets you backup your entire library of books, magazines or newspapers onto Amazon's Servers. This gives you complete piece of mind in case you lose or break your Kindle. You can then re-download for free wirelessly whenever you want.

### 5) X-Ray Feature

This feature allows you to really explore any book you are reading. Just tap and you can see all the passages of the book that mention particular topics or places of interest, historical figures, fictional characters or other ideas and then get more descriptive details from

Wikipedia about it. It really adds to the experience of reading an eBook especially if you are reading a non-fiction book such as something from history or an autobiography.

## **Kindle Vs Sony eReader - An Engineer Reveals Which is Better and the Answer is Not What You Think**

Kindle and Sony both keep coming out with new models and better features -- such as the Kindle 2 and Sony PRS 700, but this article will concentrate on the real differences between the Kindle and the Sony eReaders regardless of which new or used model you choose.

First the big advantage of all e-readers over reading a book on a laptop or smart phone is that they all use the E-Ink display technology which is way easier on the eyes than looking at a computer screen.

When you read a review and the writer is talking about little things like where the on-off switch is or how easy the volume control is to use or which reader has a more high-tech look, there is one thing you know for sure -- he can't find any earth-shattering differences to report on.

And the truth is that you can't go wrong with either brand. I have used them both and they both fit my needs, but since you have to decide, there are a few differences you need to be aware of.

Here are the important differences to consider:

The Kindle has a slightly better display. It's easier to read and the Kindle 2 even has a smoother looking screen that looks more like a sheet of paper rather than the slightly grainy newspaper look of the older Kindles. There is a little more glare to the Sony screen.

The Kindle joystick navigation and buttons are somewhat awkward and not as easy to use as the Sony touch-screen.

The Kindle display has 16 shades of gray as compared to the 8 shades for the Sony. You can't tell the difference when reading text, but you can see the difference when viewing images. The 8 shades is a big improvement over the earlier e-readers that only had 4 shades.

It's easier to scroll and turn pages with the Sony readers.

These are all minor things ...

The real difference comes down to two things:

#1. How important is Internet connectivity to you and how important is the ability to download books immediately without having to connect your eReader to your computer? This free Internet connectivity feature of the Kindle allows you to use the dictionary or research something on Wikipedia while you're reading. Great for doing research. No big deal if you're just reading a novel.

#2. With the Kindle eReader you use their proprietary AZW format and Sony readers use the open source EPUB format. With Sony you can download many books from your public library. With the Kindle you have access to a lot more books including 500,000 free classics. Reading pdf files is easy with the Sony and you have to jump through some hoops to read pdf files with the Kindle.

Bottom line: The Kindle's wireless connectivity, ability to browse the Internet, slightly better display and larger selection of e-books (all of which you can download instantly from almost anywhere) all add up to make the Kindle my choice.

But my brother considered the same facts and bought a Sony eReader. As I said before, you can't go wrong with either one.

The fact that you can always sell your e-reader on eBay and buy another one means you're not stuck with your decision.

## **Reading With a Kindle (or Other E-Readers) and Reducing Eye Strain**

E-readers have enjoyed increasing popularity among those who enjoy the leisure of reading. Electronic book readers are certainly changing how we read and engage with material on the page. Because the technology within these gadgets enable improved contrast ratios and increased print size, e-readers have been widely adopted by young and old as a superior alternative to reading and decreasing eye strain while doing so.

### Reading: The Old Way

In visual science, it is claimed that after the age of 40, we need twice as much light to read comfortably than when we were 30 years of age. Also, we become more dependent on the text being magnified to see near print.

Conventional books have printed text that range from small to large. Reading comfortably is dependent on lighting conditions as well as the size of the text on the page. Magnification is an option, but only with the use of a magnifying devices like handheld magnifiers with or without illumination. The comfort of long-term reading is compromised.

### Reading: The New Way

Enter the electronic reader. Wildly popular products like the Kindle or Nook have enabled readers worldwide to re-ignite the joys of reading, but reduced eye strain. This is because the electronic alternative avails to the reader both the ability to control the contrast ratios on the electronic page of text, as well as the font (print) size - all this without having to hold the reading device closer to the eyes.

How is eye strain reduced, you might ask? Well, these electronic readers enable you to increase the print size on the screen, thereby acting as magnification. Also, because these e-readers have the technology known as e-ink (electronic ink, which emulates text on paper), the reader is able to increase the contrast of the screen to adjust for lighting conditions.

E-ink text is generally more crisp with defined edges on each displayed character than what you see on a computer screen, making it easier for the reader to focus on, and in turn reduces eye strain.

Furthermore, e-readers have a flat plain of focus, unlike the curved surfaces of conventional books, which might be why owners of e-readers find it less stressful on the eyes to read at long periods of time.

Ophthalmologists agree that light levels (either too low or too high) can result in eye strain. The ability to control the contrast ratio on the e-reader enables the reader to achieve the best comfort level according to each individual.

Furthermore, because these gadgets are generally light-weight, the reader need only to position them as if holding a book. Reading distance is adjusted to the reader, rather than the reader to the electronic book.

### Helpful Hints on Reducing Eye Strain when Reading with an E-Reader

Always read in a well-lit room, but avoid glare.

Less contrast between page and text: read the e-reader's manual on how to change the page background settings. Change the background to either gray or tan. (Black text on a yellowish background seems to be the best). Lessening the contrast between page and text helps reduce eye strain.

Stop reading when you are physically tired.

Take breaks while reading: Eye strain is caused by prolonged short distance focusing. Looking up every once in a while will help your eyes relieve themselves from the strain involved. Blink often to refresh your eyes.

Get a feel of the font size: adjust the font size (increase it) so that you are able to read comfortably without straining your eyes to read. A larger font size always helps.

### What to look for when buying an eReader

The choice over which eReader to buy can be broken down into a manageable decision by determining what your needs are.

If most reading will be done in during breaks in the workday, a smaller size may be required for easy stowing. This may not be a big problem as many eReaders are small, but if you want a particularly small eReader, check out a pocket edition.

The two main screen types available on eReaders are eInk and backlit LCD. The eInk displays are designed to be easy on the eyes by presenting high contrast black text to readers.

This type of display is perfect for conditions with good lighting such as outdoors or in the office. Color eInk displays are just recently entering the market, but the majority of affordable eInk devices are incapable of displaying color images and you may not feel as though they are worth it.

Backlit LCD is closer to the experience of reading from a laptop or tablet PC. This can be perfect for night readers but can be hard to read in direct sunlight. There are more complaints of eye strain with backlit LCD displays, but this is not an issue for all users.

Different models of eReaders have different control options. Many new models, especially those that have multiple functions, utilize full touch screen. Older style of dedicated eReaders often just have hardware controls limited directly to the functions necessary to switch books and turn pages. Customers should weigh their preference on how they would like to interact with their device when shopping for a particular model.

A few eReaders are designed to work with particular online libraries, often with a limiting or even proprietary eBook format. The most forgiving eReaders, when it comes to file formats, tend to be third-party devices with no allegiance to any particular library or online store. This is a plus on the capability end, but the lack of subsidized pricing from partners and smaller companies is apparent in the final price tag. These devices tend to be on the more expensive end of the spectrum. Adobe's PDF file type and the ePub format make up the most widely available free eBooks on the internet. These two formats are also supported by a wide range of devices.

In the Age of Convergence, even dedicated devices such as eReaders are often loaded with extra functions. These options can be big selling points, depending on what the customer may be looking for. Some of the noteworthy wells and whistles include mp3 playback for users interested in reading with background music, web browsing, and text to voice to transform those eBooks into audio books which some readers may particularly enjoy.

There is an eReader out there for almost every taste and need imaginable. Whether you want a multipurpose device but don't need a full tablet, or just need a dedicated reader for a quick read on the go, the choices are out there. An eReader can allow readers to carry thousands of books while taking up around the same space as one book and most importantly, not reducing your reading experience.
