OCTOBER IS DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AWARENESS MONTH

One in three women, one in ten men and one in four teens will be a victim of domestic violence. I have been working with victims of domestic violence for almost 14 years. I have also been educating our community about domestic violence and the effects it has on children, families and the workplace for nearly the same amount of time. A few questions are always asked of me during the education presentations-Why does a victim stay in an abusive relationship? The answer to this is POWER AND CONTROL. We have worked with wealthy women, educated women, poor women, women of color and of different cultures. It makes no difference where you come from or where you fall on the socioeconomic chart. Domestic violence is not prejudice in its ability to gain power and control over its victim. It isn't just about physical abuse, it is about a cycle of abuse and a perpetrator that has gained control of their victim financially, and emotionally. A perpetrator will use

intimidation, isolation, coercion and threats to kill, harm, take children, family and community from their victim. The question to the victim is not should I leave but rather where will I go? How will I support myself? Will my perpetrator come after me? Will I be able to take my child with me? Will I be able to feed and shelter my child? The question of why do they stay becomes many more questions to a victim of domestic violence.

For 29 years The Center for New Beginnings has attempted to be the answer to these questions for a victim by providing shelter, safety, and support to victims of domestic violence in this community.
