- Ex 1. People v. Hence & Gallagher, No. 79-911862 (Wayne Co. Cir. Court, 10/30/80), (V. Baum, J.)
- Ex 2. Complaint, charging Hence & Gallagher with murder-1, and conspiracy to commit same.
- Ex 3. Jury instructions, where it was required that jury find Hence <u>and</u> Gallagher committed crime.
- Ex 4. Transcript quotes where deliberating jury sent notes asking for evidence, & further instructions.
- Ex 5. Confidential letter from Grievance Commission, revealing atty. "significantly impaired entire time" he represented Hence.
- Ex 6. Disciplinary action imposed upon Mr. Mouradian while he represented Hence, including: two suspensions, three reprimands, fines, etc., all for similarly botching other indigent appeals.
- Ex 7. Successor Judge's decisions (portions) where: in 1984, he denied relief based upon Mr. Mouradian's grossly erroneous ad lib, and, in 1988, relief was denied using a different theory.
- Ex 8. Letter from ACLU, regarding poor representation Hence received from appointed counsel.
- Ex 9. Recanting Affidavit, of Norman Wayne "Worm" Robinson, which the appeal prosecutor successfully threatened, and coerced, him into retracting.
