

- That same appeal prosecutor then secretly promised the witness he'd get a commutation if he lied, again, and said Henry was guilty. Which the witness promptly did. p. 12.

- That witness (whose fingerprint had been discovered on the dead man's body) has since received a commutation of his life sentence, with the appeal prosecutor's help. p. 12.

- In front of a successor judge, at oral arguments on Henry's separate appeal, his appointed appeal counsel admitted that he knew nothing of the case (codef's reversal, alternate suspect, etc.) since he hadn't obtained any of the transcripts, court records, or even court decisions! p. 36.

- That appeal counsel was Suspended, Fined, & Reprimanded for filing sham briefs, and similarly botching the appeals of other indigent defendants, all while he was (mis)representing Hence. p. 35.

- And, according to the Griv. Comm., that now disbarred attorney was also "significantly physically & emotionally impaired the entire time he represented Mr. Hence." p. 35.

- In short, Henry was indigent, but his jointly tried codef hired trial & appeal counsel. So, 30 years later, 1 is free, and 1 is in prison. p. 38.
