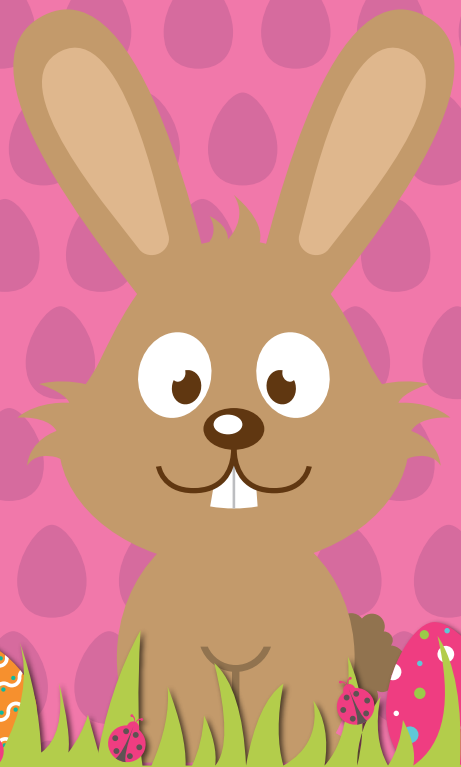

Dear Little one 

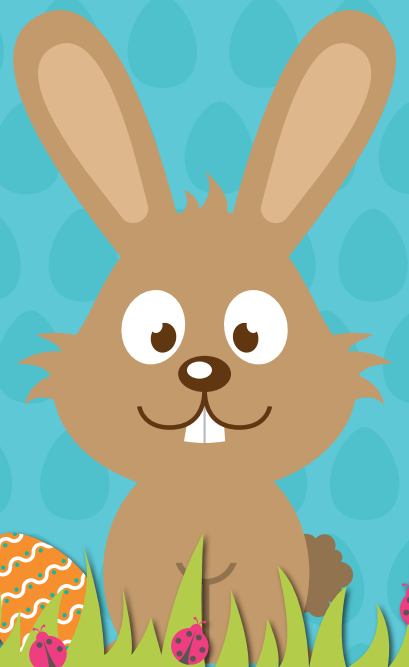
Easter has arrived and I've been busy, busy, busy

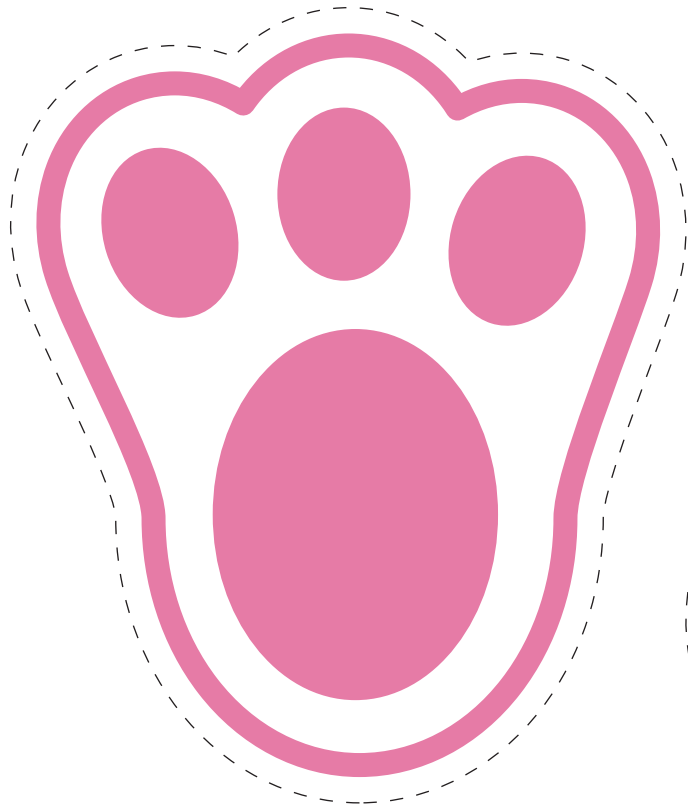


## BUNNY PAW PRINTS

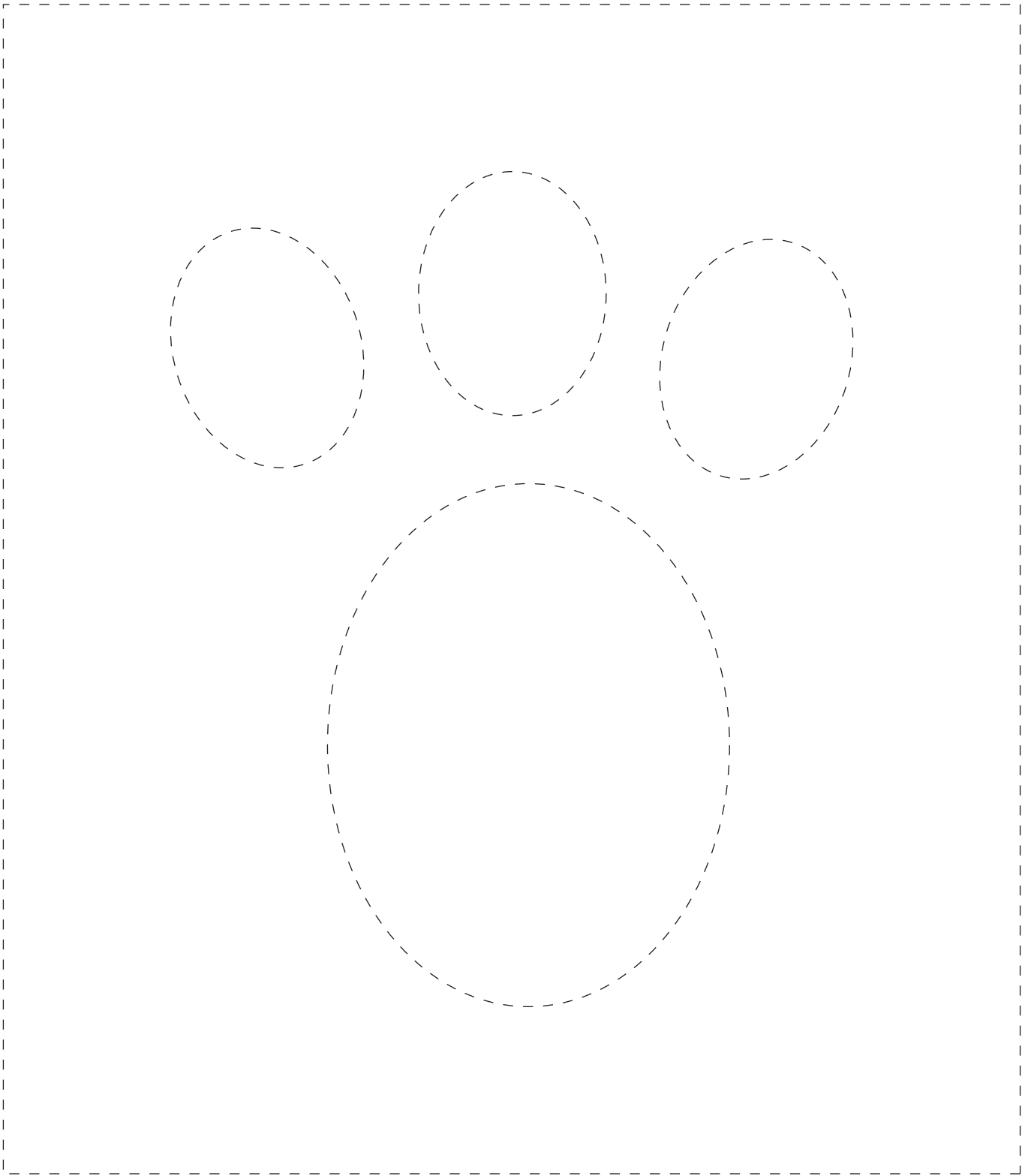


## STENCIL FOOTPRINTS

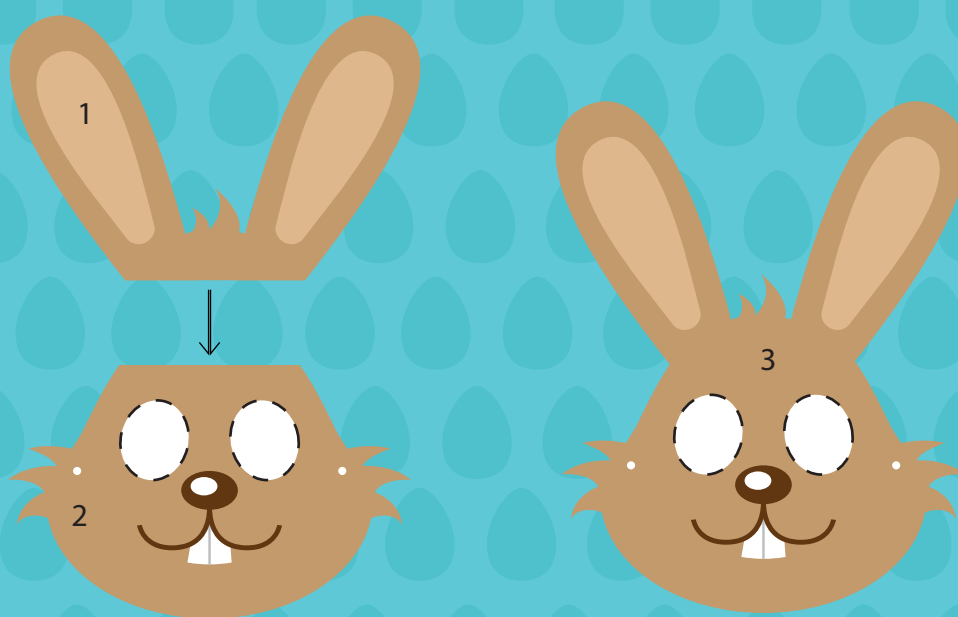
## PRINTABLE BUNNY MASK

Get into the Easter spirit and give your little ones the chance to be their own Easter Bunny with a printable bunny mask.

Instructions:

1. Cut around the outlined shapes with a pair of scissors
2. Glue the mask and ears to a piece of cardboard
3. Cut out the holes for the eyes with a craft knife
4. Punch holes in the side for a piece of elastic or ribbon
5. Tie an elastic or ribbon through the holes on the side of the mask

Editorial Tip: If you don't have any spare cardboard laying around, use an old cereal box.



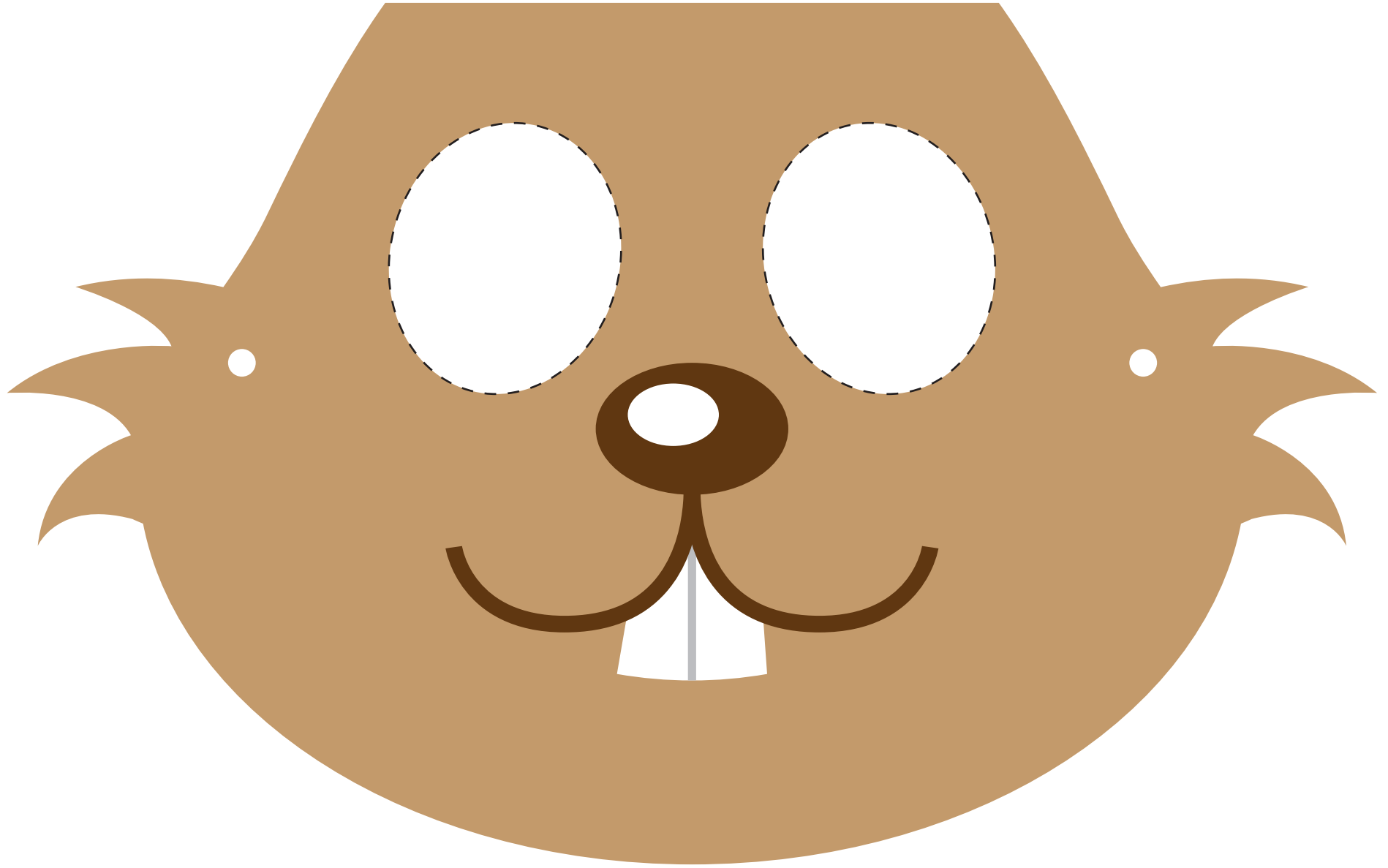
**Glue 1 and 2 together on cardboard to create 3**

## MAKE YOUR OWN EASTER EGG BASKET

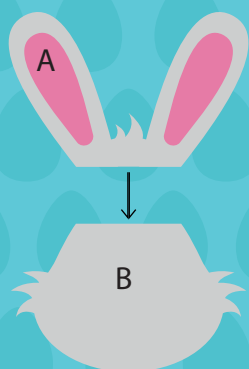
Better than a plastic bag, this cute bunny-face Easter-Egg basket is fun for the kids to make, and provides a whimsical keepsake that will last long after the last crumbs of chocolate have melted into the couch cushions.

You need:

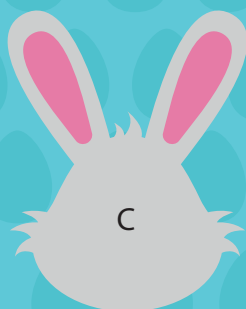
- Cardboard
- Punch
- Stapler
- Glue

Instructions

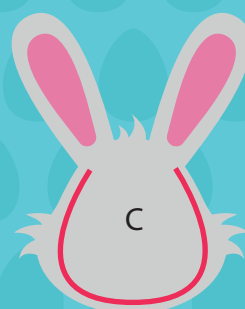
1. Cut around the outlined shapes with a pair of scissors
2. Glue all the shapes to a piece of cardboard, glueing the ears (A) to the top of the back-piece (B)
3. Cut out the shapes
4. Glue or staple the face to the back-piece
5. Punch holes in the side for a piece of elastic or ribbon



**Glue A and B together on cardboard to create C**



**Glue or staple D onto C along the outside**

## BUNNY-EARS ALICEBAND

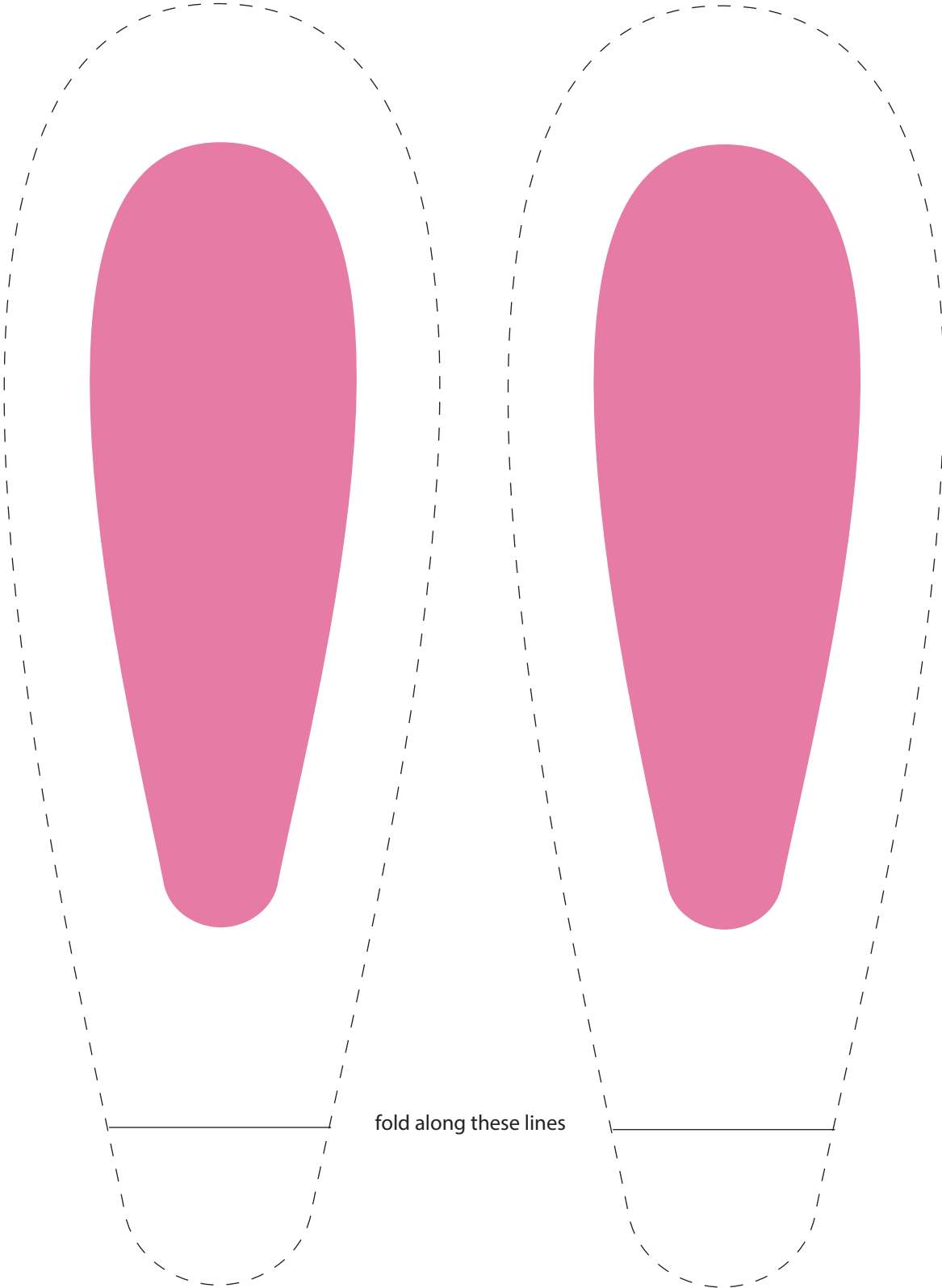
Simply cut out the ears, stick them onto some cardboard and then attach them to a spare alice-band.

Alternatively: create a headband with a strip of cardboard attach them to that.

Editorial Tip: If you don't have any spare cardboard laying around, use an old cereal box.

# HOW TO MAKE A POM-POM BUNNY TAIL

## What you need

- Cardboard
- Scissors
- Yarn

## Instructions

### Step 1:

Trace a circle onto the cardboard and cut out two circles, removing a section from each.  
Use the bottom of a glass to make the circles

Example: (figure1)

### Step 2:

Cut a piece of yarn about 30cm long and put it between the two circles. This will be the tie that holds the pom-pom together

Example: (figure2)

### Step 3:

Hold the two pieces of cardboard together so the yarn doesn't slip out. Take yarn from the skein and begin wrapping it around the cardboard circles – beginning in the centre, wrap to the right and then wrap back to the centre, over the left and finishing in the centre. The more yarn you wrap around, the denser your pom-pom will be.

### Step 4:

Make a loose slipknot with the tie yarn that is sandwiched between the cardboard.

### Step 5:

Slip your scissors in between the two pieces of cardboard and begin cutting around the circle. When you are finished, tighten the tie yarn slipknot as tight as you can get it. Make another slipknot to secure the pom-pom. Slip the cardboard templates away from the yarn.
