Lubbock Habitat for Humanity hosts volunteers from the Marine Corps

[LUBBOCK, Texas] (August 5, 2013) - This Saturday, September 7, volunteers from the Marine Corps will be documenting their experience building a home with Lubbock Habitat for Humanity from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm at 2201 Duke Street.

The volunteer group will be comprised of current officers and new recruits from the Lubbock area. This day of service will be one of the first experiences for the new recruits before heading to boot camp. Recruits will finish framing, brace trusses and raise foam board on the home.
