Team Overview:

Boasting the youngest bench and deepest pipeline of developing talent, In Theo We Trust is built for the long haul. The prospect cupboard is filled with impact power bats and power arms that are mostly greater than 1 year away.

This youth movement contrasts sharply with what is the oldest lineup card in the league, mostly dotted with players on the wrong side of 30. This veteran lineup will provide steady if not spectacular production buoyed by strong OBP and SLG.

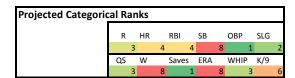
The rotation will be a work in process until Fernandez and Moore return for the playoff push and still probably needs one more impact arm to be considered a strength. The short-handed interim period may cause some strategic shifts with regards to SP's and RP's to keep the staff above water and competitive.

Team Strengths:

- Outfield Anchored by Mike Trout with a good mix of young and old run producers, this outfield should be good and has considerable upside should CarGo bounce back or Soler/Myers make a leap.
- Prospects No team can match Theo's 14 members of the MLB.com Top 100 list including 5 of the top 10. Time will tell if these players end up being future contributors or merely trade bait.
- Power The present day lineup and the prospect pipeline has one common theme - "light-tower" power. With Soler, Bryant, Encarnacion and some fast-rising kids, 40 HR potential is plentiful.

Team Weaknesses:

- Age 10 out of 14 starting hitters are 30 or greater with 2 at 35 or older. This team needs to add productive youth to the
- Trout/Soler/Myers/Bryant core by year's end and maybe sooner. - #3-#6 Starting Pitchers - There's not much that can be counted on
- beyond Scherzer and Strasburg to open the year. These crucial spots will need to be filled along the way with a quick hook for underperformers.
- Speed Aside from Trout and a potentially resurgent CarGo, there will be little to zero action on the basepaths for Theo's bunch. Time will tell if this is simply a permanently punted category or a temporary weaknees.
