The Order of Asclepius has once again helped bring basic health services to the people of the province of Negros Occidental through its circumcision caravan last May 16-20, 2015.

With partners RGO Foundation, headed by Dr. Cris Sorongon (Batch 24), Rotaract Club of Bacolod South, and Tambal of University of St. La Salle, the organization catered to a total of 506 patients.

On its first stop, 197 children from Manapla, Negros Occidental were circumcised.

This was followed by 85 from Brgy. Suay, Himamaylan where a medical mission was simultaneously conducted by a Canada-based medical organization. One of the volunteer doctors was Dr. Nee Otero-Maravilla from OA Batch 13.

On its third to fifth day, the group went to Hinoba-an, Negros Occidental and served three more communities. That is, 124 from Brgy. Bacuyangan, 45 from Brgy. Sangke, and 55 from Brgy. Daug.

The surgical mission caravan was co-organized by Ms. Mary Beth Paypon for Manapla, Brgy. Capt. Cherrie Hope Belarga for Himamaylan, and Brgy. Kag. Jason Tupas for Hinoba-an. #
