


OPENREACH NGA TEAM

Short Explanation about the Project. At the end of 2013 after a ten year campaign direct with BT to get broadband to the estate, Danny Lucas a NFP resident was finally able to get commitment for the park to be fibre enabled from the then CEO of British Telecom Liv Garfield. This was a watershed moment as Openreach, a divsion of BT agreed to engage directly with the residents association of NFP. Liv assigned the project to her Openreach director Kim Mears who delegated the project to Colin Brooks and his team. Rick Meyrick and Danny Lucas attended a kick off meeting with Colin in January 2014 and the parties agreed a way forward. The meeting was attended by Peter Cowen a BT director and an estimated completion date of Q3 2014 was given.
