ELT: English Language Teaching or English Language Training

EFL: English as a Foreign Language

ESL: English as a 2nd Language

ESOL: English for Speakers of Other Languages

EAL: English as an Added Language

TEFL: Teaching English as an International Language

TESL: Teaching English as a 2nd Language

TEAL: Teaching English as an Extra Language

TESOL: Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages

All the above abbreviations are used for basically the very same thing, nevertheless, you may discover that usually ESL is utilized for non-native speakers discovering English in an English speaking nation, and EFL is for non-native-speakers learning English in a non-English speaking environment, such as their own country. Moreover, Americans have the tendency to use ESL more, and British instructors tend to utilize EFL. EAL is an effort to bridge the gap in between the two. Frequently people find out English not as their 2nd language, but as their third, 4th or more. Also, EAL prevents utilizing the word "international", which is thought about by the more politically correct to have an undesirable reasoning.

Do I need a certificate to teach English?

There are lots of chances around the world to teach English without a certificate. However, accreditation does assist, specifically if there is an application procedure included and positions are competitive.

Do I need to speak an international language to teach people English?
