

With current opinion polls showing that up to 85% of the construction industry want the UK to remain in the EU, this debate will facilitate a discussion between industry and academic experts on the potential impact of BREXIT on the sector.

Could it worsen the construction sector's skills shortage and constrain investment in new house-building, for example, therefore further worsening the UK's housing shortage?

How would key changes, for example in taxation and restrictions on labour migration from other EU states affect the cost of construction projects? What would the impact be on the sector's supply chain?

As any changes to the freedom of movement provisions are likely to have repercussions for the property industry, how will this affect UK businesses?

This event will provide an opportunity to learn from industry and academic experts on the likely impacts this referendum will have not only on the UK construction sector, but also on individual property owners, investors, and UK businesses in general.
