Tuesday 15th November

Heading towards the north of County Dublin we will visit three coastal villages Howth, Malahide and Skerries. Howth is a busy fishing village and ranks as one of the best places in Ireland for seafood lovers. Its rich array of restaurants, markets, and cafes justify the tag serving the freshest seafood straight from the fishing boats. From the upmarket restaurants to the local fish and chip shop, there is something for everyone here.



Further up the coastline lies the historical town of Skerries where we indulge afternoon tea in unique surroundings with some local food producers.

Our final port of call is Malahide, a bustling village sitting along a marina and a sandy beach nearby. The cute cafes are busy all day and the evenings are very lively with plenty of stylish restaurants. We'll finish our tour with food from one of Ireland's best known chefs and listen to an Irish song or two in the local bar.
