This sneak-preview of autumn continues in Triangle (B-r-r-r-r-r)

A cold front moved into the area over the Labor Day weekend, sending temperatures downward and giving Hamilton residents a sneak preview of impending autumn weather.

According to official Journal News weather observer George Johnson, the Labor Day high temperature was only a cool 75. Brief showers yesterday brought .46 inches of rain to the already waterlogged land.

This morning's low was a brisk 53.

The precipitation should let up today with the forecast calling for clear skies and cool temperatures. Low tonight is expected to plunge into the mid 40's.

Wednesday's muck is sunny and cool with highs to reach only the mid 60's.

The extended forecast shows fair and mild weather for Thursday through

Saturday. High will be in the 70's Thursday and warming to the low 80's by Saturday.

KENTUCKY Decreasing cloudiness and cool tonight with a chance of rain east. Lows in the 30s. Partly cloudy and cool Wednesday. Highs in the mid to upper 60's.

Hamilton police are investigating two armed robberies which occurred in a 90-minute period Monday night.
