- ✓ Attend High Holiday services.
 - ✓ Hear the sound of the *Shofar*.
Estimated Shofar blowing time:
1:00pm & 6:00pm
at the Chabad House
(alternate opportunities available. Contact us)
 - ✓ Eat a festive meal.
 - ✓ TASHLICH - "Throw out" your sins to the fish in the water.
- Other traditions include:
- ✓ Greet one another on the first night of *Rosh Hashanah* with:
"Lshana tova tikatev v'tichatem"
(=May you be inscribed and sealed for a good year!).
 - ✓ Enjoy an apple dipped in honey.



Yom Kippur

October 11 - 12

Times:

Candle Lighting/Fast Begins:6:03
Fast Ends:7:00

Laws & Customs:

- Before Yom Kippur:
- ✓ Perform the ancient custom of Kaparot.
 - ✓ It is a Mitzvah to eat and drink heartily on the day before Yom Kippur (Oct. 11).
- On Yom Kippur:
- ✓ Attend synagogue.
 - ✓ Recite Yizkor (Prayer of Remembrance).
- 1:30pm at the Chabad House.
- ✗ Do not eat or drink for the entire duration of the fast.
 - ✗ Do not wear leather shoes.
 - ✗ Do not wash any part of your body.
 - ✗ Do not have marital relations.

Laws & Customs:

- ✓ Eat & drink in a Sukkah during the holiday.
- ✓ Make a blessing on the *Lulav & Etrog* (four species), every day except *Shabbat*.
- ✓ Attend synagogue for the special Holiday services.
- ✓ Be happy and rejoice.



Simchat Beit HaShoeva

Every night during *Sukkot*, we also celebrate *Simchat Beit HaShoeva*, "Festival of Water Drawing".

This commemorates the joy that occurred when water, symbolizing happiness beyond intellect, was poured on the Altar in the Holy Temple.

At the *Simchat Beit Hashoeva*, we dance and sing to express our happiness and confidence that very soon indeed, we will once again pour water on the Altar in the Holy Temple!

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Rosh Hashana:

On Rosh Hashanah we ask G-d to rule over us and make His sovereignty known over the entire world. Moshiach will accomplish this in the ultimate way by building the Holy Temple and bringing all of mankind to acknowledge G-d.

Yom Kippur:

On Yom Kippur, we act like spiritual beings by focusing on the knowledge that G-d is the only reality in our universe. It is this reality that will become apparent with Moshiach's

arrival, as the prophet Isaiah states: "The world will be filled with the knowledge of G-d as waters fill and cover the seas".

Sukkot:

During our daily prayers, we ask G-d: "Spread Your Sukkah of peace over us." This refers to a revelation of G-dly light that Moshiach will reveal, which in turn, will unite all of mankind under G-d's 'Sukkah' of sovereignty.

Shemini Atzeret-Simchat Torah:

According to our sages, joy enables a person to go beyond his or her own sense of self. Moshiach will bring that true joy and selflessness to the entire world!
