Welcome to your Leeds International Film Festival

With over 300 films and events at LIFF30, we know it can be daunting to know where to start, especially if you haven't been to the Film Festival before. This YA programme has been specially curated for young adults to help you get the most out of the festival and see some amazing films.

If you are 15 – 18 you can get a YA Delegate Pass for just £15 that gives you access to the 15 films listed below. These are all screening in the amazing Victoria Hall at Leeds Town Hall, our premiere venue with 7.1 concert sound. With a mixture of brand new previews and some classic archive films, at just £15 you can't afford not to give it a go!



How To Use Your YA Pass

You can purchase your pass online at leedsfilm.com or in person/over the phone at City Centre Box Office (0113 376 0318, Leeds Town Hall, Mon-Sat, 10am-6pm).

Tickets for each film can then be obtained in person at the box office or at the venue before the film (subject to availability). You must show your pass and a form of ID to obtain your tickets.
