How to identify a false Shrek

Step One

Become familiar with the true form of Shrek. Make sure you study, because some imposters are extremely similar.



Step Two

Learn to Identify an Imposter


- * Strange movement patterns
- * Glazed over, or strange looking eyes
- * Different shade of green tone
- * Elongated or mishapen head or ears

Commonly Seen Imposters:

"Video Game Shrek"

At first glance he seems to bear a striking resemblance, until you take a closer look...


- * Misshapen arms
- Odd colored eyes
- Mouth and nose are slightly off



"Self-Animated or Modified Shrek"

Commonly found in fanmade comedic videos


- Can be created by amateur animators
- Has appeared in several Vine videos
- * The "glazed-over" or hollow eyes



"App Shrek"

This is the version of Shrek that appears in low budget apps

 Upon examination, you can clearly tell that it is a fake. Enough said.



"GIF Shrek"

A deceiving version of Shrek that appears in GIF files


- * You could mistake him for the real deal at first, but he has "misshapen face" characteristic.
- His eyes are farther set back than normal



"Professionally Created Shrek"

This version of Shrek was designed by someone with skill. This is the most convincing and definitely would be easy to mistake.

- Very realistic textures and details
- * Artfully created overall, but also a fake.
