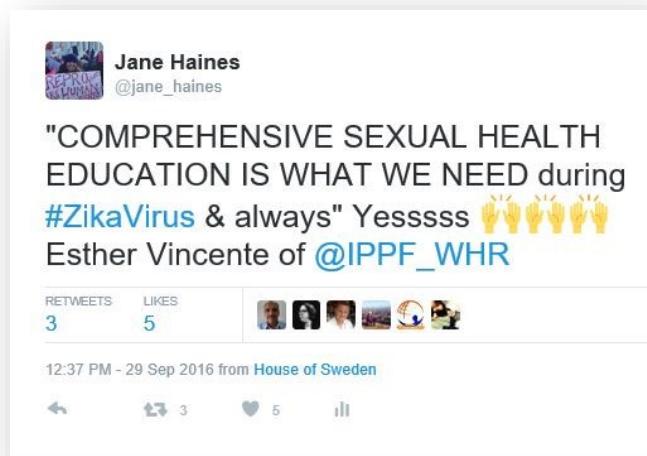
PARTNERS TWITTER REVAMP

DENVER RESIDENT LEADS SUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURE WORKSHOPS IN ECUADOR

U.S. Government Program Benefits Farmers in Latin America

ESMERALDAS, ECUADOR – This notice is to inform you of local Denver resident Thomas Winkel's a unique experience traveling to Ecuador through Partners of the Americas and the Farmer-to-Farmer Program. We believe his experience will be of interest to your local readers.

What: On this volunteer assignment, Mr. Winkel traveled to Ecuador to train field technicians and community members of Comunidad Viche, a community based in Esmeraldas, Ecuador that participates in the U.S. Department of Labor's EducaFuturo program. During his assignment, Mr. Winkel led workshops in sustainable agriculture and cacao best management practices with the goal that community members apply these skills to improve their local gardens and farms. This was Mr. Winkel's third trip with the Farmer-to-Farmer program and his second trip with the program to Ecuador. He previously served as a Peace Corps volunteer in Ecuador, where he developed a strong understanding and appreciation for the Ecuadorian people, as well as an enthusiasm to share his technical knowledge at every possible opportunity.

When: February 27-March 13, 2016

Where: Comunidad Viche, Esmeraldas, Ecuador

How: The trip was sponsored by Partners of the Americas as part of the John Ogonowski and Doug Bereuter Farmer-to-Farmer (F2F) Program. Partners' F2F program sends U.S. agriculturalists on volunteer assignments to improve economic opportunities in rural areas of Latin America and the Caribbean by increasing food production and distribution, promoting better farm and marketing operations, and conserving natural resources. The program is supported by Congress and funded by the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID).

Founded in 1964, Partners is a private, nonprofit, non-partisan organization with international offices in Washington, D.C. Our mission is to connect people and organizations across borders to serve and to change lives through meaningful partnerships. Partners has implemented the F2F Program for 25 years in 30 countries in Latin America, the Caribbean, and Africa.
