Upon consideration of FMC Butner's reports, as supplemented by Dr. Stribling Riley, Dr. Pennuto, and Dr. Herbel's testimonies, the Court finds that Defendant is competent to proceed to trial.

**Order to enter.**

Defense counsel advised the Court that Defendant desires to waive his right to a detention hearing, subject to reopening.

Defendant placed under oath and questioned regarding waiving such rights.

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Court finds that Defendant knowingly, intelligently, voluntarily, and freely waived his right to a detention hearing subject to reopening.

**Order of Detention to enter.**

Defense counsel advised the Court that Defendant desires to waive his right to the preliminary hearing within the 14 day time period, reserving his right to a preliminary hearing within 120 days.

Defendant placed under oath and questioned regarding waiving such rights.

Court finds that Defendant knowingly, intelligently, voluntarily, and freely waived his right to a preliminary hearing within the 14 day time period, but reserving his right to the hearing within 120 days.
