Be Prepared:

You must bring a Palm Beach area map, detector, pinpointer, digging tools for a park, playground, old house site and a scoop for sand lots...Bring your camera, or phone to take pictures to share afterwards.

Food:

John Lobota will provide BBQ chicken and the club will provide the plates, cups and utensils. Club members are asked to bring a small / med side dish, to share and their own beverages. Let John know what you are planning on bringing so there is a balanced menu.

Directions from north:
