When going to the beach, check the night before to see when low tide is going to start. There are a number of tide charts out there. Find one that you like. Also, check to see if that area has an online web cam. The reason that we do this is because most of these sites have pictures from the past 24 hours and you can see where people were sitting and when there was a lot of traffic on the sand and in the water.

I normally check to see when people were there and when most left the beach. Also you will see where people went into the water most of the time.

Most people when they go to the beach will pick out points of interest to put down their blankets. They will sit in front of the lifeguard stand so when they are in the water they know where their stuff is located.
