Hunting the Beaches that Have Large Rocks

When hunting beaches that have a lot of rock formations, go around the bottom and try to get into the areas under the rocks. Most rocks will have iron in them because coral mixes with the rocks over time. I use a probe to get into some of the areas that I can't get with my coil. Check the holes that have shells in them; if the shell can get in there, then coins and jewelry can too. We went up to Jupiter where they have the Coral Cove Park. In areas that will not let you use a metal detector in the water you can go into the water along the edge during low tide with your probe. Try it the next time you are out and you never know what you will find. I spoke to the Ranger at Coral Cove Park and asked about going into the water with a metal detector and he said as long as the Lifeguards don't mind he has no problem with it. Just make sure that you get the lifeguard's name.

Also remember that that park is where people snorkel because it is very rocky and you have to walk over the rocks to get into the ocean.
