STRANGE sounds from the Fourth Officer's locked cabin puzzled the crew of the banana-boat Jamaica Producer. . . .

Till the ship was two and a half days out from London . . . and the officer's twenty-year-old fiancée crawled from a cupboard beneath his bunk and confessed:

"I AM A STOWAWAY."

Yesterday, the story of typist Angela Mullane's bid to travel to the West Indies with her fiancé, Martin Galpin, 26, was told at West Ham magistrates' court.

First Voyage

Raven-haired Angela, of Coggershall-road, Braintree, Essex, was fined £20 for stowing away. Galpin, who also comes from Braintree, was fined £20 for aiding her. They were also ordered to pay £5 15s. costs each.

The magistrates said the fines would be paid to the shipping company as compensation.

Mr. D. E. Hill-Smith, prosecuting for the shipping company, Kay and Co., Ltd., told the magistrates:

"It was only because other officers heard unaccountable noises from behind the locked door that questions were asked."

He said the 6,905-ton ship sailed from London on New Year's Eve.

It was Galpin's first voyage as an officer. He had been seen with the girl on the ship before it sailed, then the master, Captain Kidd, found that she was aboard when they were two and a half days out.

Locked In

The girl was then locked in a stateroom.

BUT, said Mr. Hill-Smith, she twice managed to slip through a porthole and on to the main deck.

Her fares as a passenger would have been £92 10s.

Angela and Galpin apologised in court. They left arm-in-arm and said: "We are very much in love."

Seven years for killer
