

### **Brugmansia ANGEL TRUMPETS**

The necessity for fragrant summer evenings! Brugmansia are the Queen of the tropical plants. A few easy pointers will help you be successful.

\*While they are tropical, they come from higher elevations, so in Missouri, they do best protected from hot afternoon sun. East and North exposures are good. \*They are HEAVY feeders. Most that fail to perform either have too much shade or not enough food. Our recipe during growing season: Top dress twice with Osmocote, April and July. Topdress with Milorganite every two weeks April thru September. Liquid feed with Miracle Gro or Peters 20-20-20 EVERY time you water.

\*Before a freeze in fall, remove all leaves and blooms and trim back green tips. Store above 40 degrees in a cool dark area. Basement, garage, spare room. Water only when soil is dry during dormancy.





# All About Epis...

Once you witness the bloom of the Orchid Cactus you will forever be hooked. Many have grown and heard of the Night Blooming Cereus, that flowers only in the middle of the night. I had one for years but grew a little tired of missing the show unless I stayed up late. But the Epiphylums have a wide range of colors, some are fragrant and best of all hold their blooms open for several days. Mature baskets can easily have 50 –100 flowers open. While not truly a cactus and definitely not an orchid, the orchid cactus is an easy to grow plant. They like indirect light or bright shade. We water and fertilize regularly in the growing season. One application of Osmocote slow release and then 20-20-20 liquid with every watering March thru October. During the off season they do best kept drier, no fertilizer and if you happen to have an unheated porch or spare bedroom that doesn't freeze, a cooler temperature will help produce more blooms in the spring. We generally get two seasons of flowering from the Epi's. April and October. We offer 70+ varieties of rooted 4" pots, small hanging baskets, and cuttings if you would like to root your own.

# Tips for a Well Designed Landscape

Sometimes it is difficult to see what is right in front of you. Our landscape tastes and decisions are influenced by many sources. What are our neighbors doing? What have we done in the past? What did we grow up with? Many factors contribute to how we perceive a pleasing landscape and like all things subjective, beauty often lies in the eyes of the beholder. Below are some common guidelines for achieving a pleasing low maintenance land-

- 1. Decide how much light you have. Many times the problem with a plant Full sun is 6 hours of sun or more. Plants from cooler climates like a little afternoon shade in Missouri. Some shade plants (like hydrangeas) need just a little morning sun to keep them vigorous enough to bloom.
- Plants don't grow well in clay. Yes, some live but few thrive and now is the time to make their home the best it can be. If you have clay, don't dig it out, you only create a bathtub full of good soil that holds water and eventually drowns your new plants. Better to add 6 inches of good topsoil and compost on top and they can stick their roots into the clay if they want to. This creates a slightly raised bed, without the need for edging or blocks. The plants will have perfect drainage and you won't waste time fighting clay.
- How big is that plant going to get? All tags on plants are estimates but it is the best guideline we have. If it is a cute little evergreen in a little pot, it may or may not get 1 foot tall or 60 feet tall in 15 years. Read the tag. There is no greater tragedy than to watch a plant grow into a beautiful specimen and then one day realize it is too big for the space, it has grown into other plants or the walls of your home. Pruning is always possible, but that little mantra we hear over and over again Low Maintenance—leaves no room for pruning on a regular basis.
- Arrangement. A weed is a plant out of place. So put your landscape plants in the right place. Most landscapes surround a house to soften its corners and anchor it into the site. Whenever possible think a little larger and make the planting beds around your home a little wider and deeper. This will allow for layers, plants planted in groups with the taller behind, which makes for a beautiful presentation from the road. If you only have room for a single "row" of plants, due to sidewalk or other restrictions, avoid an every other one approach. Better to group like plants together and then add another grouping or specimen for interest on the ends. Think of how things look from your favorite windows. Landscapes should enhance the beauty of the home looking from inside out too. 4.
- Edging; who needs it? You don't unless you like to run a weedeater. The best edge is a v-shaped trench you make with a shovel between the lawn and your planting bed. This gets filled with mulch after you plant. It can be tidied up in a year or two if needed. No edging makes the focus on the planting, not a block wall from a box store that everybody has. And best of all, you mow right up to it with no need for trimming.
- After your plants are properly planted do not even consider landscape fabric or plastic. This is the single largest mistake most people make and always regret it. The object of the game here is to create a great environment for plant growth. Plastic sheeting and landscape fabric both seal the soil and keep the natural process of composting from taking place. A weed pulled from mulch pulls right out. Weeds love to root into landscape fabric and are impossible to pull. Mulch placed on top of landscape fabric eventually decomposes as it is supposed to so allow that good compost to go to your roots as it should. Which is why top of landscape fabric eventually decomposes as it is supposed to so allow that good compost to go to your roots as it should. Which is why gravel and rubber mulch are bad options. If your topsoil has weed seeds or you just want some insurance, place a couple layers of newspapers or single layer of paper feed sacks under your mulch. Any seeds that have been brought to the surface will germinate and then die under the paper. In a few months the paper is gone and the mulch can decompose and enrich your plantings as nature intended. Then someday when a renovation is needed, you are working with beautiful soil. Apply a 3-4 inch layer of mulch. Keep the mulch thin around the crown and trunks of plants, you want to mulch the root zone not choke out the plant. A good hardwood mulch is an excellent choice. The new dyed mulches make the planting look freshly done longer. Always opt for a dark brown mulch for a more natural look. Red mulches are trendy but do little to enhance the natural beauty of plants.

### While You Are In The Area...

Vintage Hill Farm is located in the Boone's Lick area of central Missouri, a virtually undiscovered haven for the tourist. People here are friendly, prices are reasonable, and there are so many beautiful things to do while here. Why not take an extra day or two?

Be sure to eat at Emmett's Kitchen and Tap (660) 248-3363 on the square.

Complete the circle back to New Franklin and stock up at a real quality small town butcher shop, Jennings Premium Meats (800) 210-6425. Do not miss Snoddy's Store, since 1924, on your way back. It is one of the few remaining family owned small general stores. Just a few feet east of there is the Rivercene B&B. This historical masterpiece has rooms available at www.rivercene.com. Across the bridge, over the Missouri River, is historic Boonville. Just on your left is the meticulously restored Hotel Frederick, www.hotelfrederick.com (660)-882-2828. Their in house restaurant The Revival, is a nice choice for lunch or dinner. Main Street is full of shops, a fantastic antique mall, small restaurants, Isle of Capri Casino. Try the blackened tilapia house salad at Maggie's. Spend Some time wandering among the plants and parks of downtown. Warm Springs Ranch is home to the Budweiser Clydesdales breeding facility and offers popular tours. (888)-972-5933. Be sure to visit the Visitor's Center and Museum on the Katy Trail.

Just 20 minutes east is the charming old town of Rocheport. Check out rocheport.com for the complete list. You can stay at the Yates House B&B (573) 698-2129 and they will give you the details of the many fine antique shops while you stroll through their beautiful walled gardens. Richard Saunders Antiques (573) 698-3765 has a great courtyard garden in a beautiful old brick home that should be visited. If antiquing is your thing, White Horse Antiques and Granny's are a must see also. Have a great dinner at Les Bourgeois Winery and Bistro (573) 698-2300 just a few miles out of town on the river bluffs. The view is as tantalizing as the food and is a great place to watch a sunset while overlooking the river. If you have time for an outing rent a bike along the Katy Trail from Meriwether Café. Then have a fantastic lunch when done.

Head west to visit Arrowrock and Blackwater. Arrowrock has a state historic site as well as many interesting shops and buildings. The Lyceum Theatre is a great way to spend an evening. Plan on ings. They provide the much needed height and nonstop color in plantings of annuals. Once we became aware of the canna virus we became committed to having only clean stock which we grow ourselves. The virus can infect even the new seed grown canna ht to be clean. Cannas love sun, water, fertilizer and will reward you richly with flowers for your beautiful garden. Choose the varieties below with confidence. Pictured in order left to right.

'Aurorea' Purple green leaves with large salmon flowers make this one a real showstopper. 6' or more in height. 'Bob Marley' A diminutive burst of orange, purple and gold variegated leaves with orange blooms. Much like the larger 'Phaision' but barely grows 2' tall for us.

'Gigundo' Enormous and wide purple leaves with small primitive red flowers, a favorite of hummingbirds. 'Lemon Punch' Clear yellow self cleaning flowers with medium green leaves, 4-6 feet in height.

'Longwood Erebus' Beautiful deep pink, self cleaning that can be grown in water.
'Longwood Ra' Upright narrow leaved selection with yellow flowers. Can grow submerged or regular soil.
'Longwood Endeavor' True red flowering gem of a canna growing 5-6 feet tall.

'Intrigue' Narrow leaved selection also good in ponds or garden soil. Reddish Orange flowers complement the dark purple foliage.

'Pretoria' Striking Green and gold variegation with orange flowers. Vigorous plants can top 7' with good fertilizer. 'Rose Butterflies' Deep Pink exotic flowers atop green foliage. Easily 6-7'
