112th Indiana (Minute Men During Morgan's Raid) July 10th - July 17th 1863

Activities of the 112th Indiana during the Morgan Raid

“The One Hundred and Twelfth Regiment - Comprised nine companies of Minute Men and one company of the Legion, called Mitchell Light Infantry. Lawrence county furnished six companies, Orange two, Monroe and Washington counties each one company. The regiment was organized on the 10th of July, 1863, with Hiram F. Braxton as Colonel, and contained an aggregate of seven hundred and three rank and file. The regiment was assigned to General Hughes' brigade ; moved from Mitchell to Seymour; thence to North Vernon; held that place against Morgan's forces; and thence to Sunman's Station. The enemy having escaped, the regiment proceeded to Indianapolis, where it was mustered out on the 17th of July, 1863.”

Notes: More than a handful of these men had seen service prior to and after the service of this regiment. In one such instance, Thomas Donnell who enlisted at age 15, 7 months later when enlisting into Company G, 24th Indiana at the beginning of 1864 had his age reported as 18.

These troops were to perform such duty as might be required of them in any state, and were to be armed, subsisted, clothed and paid by the United States. Upon reaching Nashville they were assigned to railroad guard duty along the lines of the Nashville & Chattanooga, Tennessee & Alabama, and Memphis & Charleston railroads. They were kept constantly engaged in this work until the latter part of Aug., 1864, serving beyond the time for which they had enlisted, keeping Sherman's lines of communication open for the transportation of supplies to his army.
