The following bids were received: The Gallipolis Motor Co. bid New Truck \$1422.00, will pay \$556.00 for old truck. Cash \$866.00. Payne Motor Sales bid new truck \$1350.48, will pay \$475.00 for old truck. Cash \$875.48. Moore Bros. bid new truck \$1425.00 will pay \$325.00 for old truck. Cash \$1100.00. The Gallipolis Motor Co. offering the lowest and best bid. Namely; \$866.00 cash and the Ford V8 truck. Same being accepted.

The City Manager was authorized to enter into a contract with the Gallipolis Motor Co. to furnish the truck in accordance with their bid.
