There are so many ways to speak up and act for change right now. One of the ways that I am working to affect change in my house is by consciously choosing the resources we use in our schooling. A move towards a decolonized homeschool is a slow process, for sure, but more and more excellent resources are available if you seek them out and make it a priority. I encourage you to do so. It's vital for us all to broaden the narrative and reframe how we see the world.

Plenty of people have comprehensive lists and I don't claim to be an expert, but I want to share what's on our bookshelves right now. This list is focused on African-American and Indigenous voices. Mind you, my kids are 10 and 12 so I don't have as many links for younger children. If you do have youngers, check out <u>Here Wee Read</u>, <u>Lee and Low</u>, and this list on <u>GoodReads</u>.

Finally, when you do go to buy, I encourage you to seek out African-American owned online booksellers. Check out this <u>list</u> for sources.
