Idukki Arch Dam

The Idukki Arch dam is recognized as the first in Asia and the world's second largest arch dam spreading over a height of 550ft. The dam was constructed over the Periyar River and between two mountains. The dam makes a lot of the electricity of the entire state. Visitors must visit this monumental dam that has gathered worldwide praise and applaud.

Thoommankuthu Falls



Thommankuthu Falls has been named after a person called Thomman who fell into the waterfall while trying to cross the river. The waterfall is recognized as the seven-step waterfall because it has seven water cascades and pools. The whole area has a number of caves and rocks that are considered as countless spots of adventure activities like rock climbing and camping.

Idukki Wildlife Sanctuary



The Idukki Wildlife Sanctuary is spread over 77 sq.km and has three dams, namely Cheruthoni, Idukki, and Kulammanu, forming a reservoir. The sanctuary is home to a variety of rare flora and fauna including the famous elephants of Kerala. The sanctuary is a must-visit for tourists wanting to see nature at its best.

Hill View Park



The high area provides a panoramic view of the area below where elephants can be seen in their natural habitat. The park is located next to the Idukki arch dam and the Cheruthony dam. The complex also has a natural water body which has boating amenities as well as an herbal garden and a children's playground.

Nandukani



Nandukani is the stunning place for a small picnic in the day. The area is on a hilltop that offers a sight of the area below and nearby districts. There is a two storied pavilion as well that makes it calmer to take in the view and adore a meal out in the open.

Thattekad Bird Sanctuary



Thattekad Bird Sanctuary was recognized by a renowned ornithologist and is home to 500 different species of rare and endangered birds. The sanctuary is situated inside dense forests and evergreen trees that spread over 25 sq.km. The branches of the Periyar river flows through the area and delivers water for the animals and birds. It is a most chanceless place to visit to see animals like leopards, bears and porcupines as well as the birds.

Kalvari Mount



The Kalvari or the Calvary Mount is situated on the way to Kattappana and is on a mountain top that offers a beautiful view of the Idukki reservoir and villages down below. The sight is breathtaking as one can also spot elephants in the forests and tea gardens on the periphery. The view point that this place offers are a must visit.
